Working with The Holiday Property Bond

Revitalise is proud to announce its partnership with The Holiday Property Bond (HPB) to help provide much-needed breaks for carers. Many carers maintain their role for long periods of time, with little or no time off. Revitalise's research shows a third of carers have not had a break since they started caring, and with 90% not being able to access a proper holiday, many are close to breaking point. The partnership with HPB gives carers essential breaks at one of HPB's holiday locations.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHIEF EXECUTIVE

2018 was another exciting year for Revitalise.

We provided a total of 4,511 breaks to disabled people and their carers and in doing so, we achieved a breakeven position before development costs relating to our planned new centre.

I am also delighted to report that for another year, more than 96% of guests visiting us rated their accommodation, level of care, level of service and their overall experience of Revitalise as good or excellent.

We were particularly grateful to receive a very generous gift from the personal estate of the late Miss Avery and this, together with the generous support of donations, grants and legacies from many different individuals, trusts, local councils and companies, has enabled us to allocate over £900,000 to subsidise the cost of breaks for

our guests. £460,000 was allocated specifically to those guests in financial need, through initiatives such as 'Before Breaking Point', The Joan Brander Memorial Fund and our Revitalise Support Fund.

In 2018, we opened two new retail units to join the other 10 Revitalise charity shops in Hampshire, close to our Netley Waterside centre. These shops contribute over £250,000 surplus per year, which goes towards vital development of our centres and helps us provide subsidised holidays for those in financial need.

Lin and Steve

Just 15 months after Lin and Steve's wedding day, Steve suffered a stroke and Lin became his carer.

Everyday life is sometimes hard for the couple and they are rarely able to take a break or just enjoy being 'husband and wife'. "Revitalise is the one place we can go to feel happy and like a couple again, and that's very important to us both. Steve can be more independent, and he has grown in confidence; he feels safe at Revitalise.

There are no words to describe what a special place it is. There is a feeling of acceptance, you can be yourself and you are treated as an individual. Without Revitalise, there would be nowhere for disabled people and earers to go."



Hilary and Shaun

Shaun is 32 and following an accident 15 years ago, has needed round-the-clock care. His mum, Hilary, cares for him at home, although she would never call herself a 'carer'. Rather, just something she does as Shaun's mum.

Shaun has been a Revitalise guest for the past 12 years.

"He really loves going to Revitalise as he gets loads of attention, hangs out with his friends and has fun. He looks forward to his holidays and always comes back with a big smile on his face. Shaun also likes to have time away from me and be an independent young person. Usually, whilst Shaun's at Revitalise, I stay at home and relax, but it's hard to get away. Shaun is my life and since his accident I've dedicated myself to him, and that's how it should be. But everyone needs a break from time to time."

Cath and Helaina

When Helaina was just a baby, she was diagnosed with Costello Syndrome - a genetic disorder which causes physical, learning and speech disabilities. With very limited information available about this rare disease, Helaina's mum Cath and her husband travelled the world to understand and educate others on the condition that was affecting their daughter. Helaina celebrated her 25th birthday this year.

For Cath and Helaina, giving back to society was a natural way forward and together, they volunteered their time at Revitalise, allowing Helaina to complete her Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award as well.

"I loved working and volunteering with Helaina. It was hard work, but I really cherished the quality time we spent together as mother and daughter. I'm so glad there is a charity such as Revitalise that offers people from all walks of life a chance to make a difference to society and themselves. They champion the ideals that I believe in equality, diversity, opportunity and letting individuals define their own strengths."
